Definition of a Stationary Machine: Use of any sewing machine that allows the quilter to move the fabric rather than the machine and the machine sits on or is mounted on a table. The stitching must predominantly use this method.

Movable Quilting Machine: Any machine that allows the quilter to move the machine head rather than the fabric and is mounted on a frame. The stitching must predominantly use this method.

## **QUILT CATEGORY DEFINITIONS**

Baby/Crib Quilt: A guilt that is meant to fit a crib. (up to 120" L + W)

Bed Size Quilt: A quilt meant to be used on a bed. (140" Minimum L + W)

First Quilt: First quilt you have ever made.

Group Quilt: Any quilt pieced by 2 or more people.

Hand Applique: A piece of fabric that is secured (or "applied") onto a background fabric with hand stitches. Does not include wool applique.

Heirloom: A quilt that has been passed down through the generations. Fifty (50) or more.

Lap Quilt: A quilt meant to curl up in and is generally smaller than a bed size quilt. (100" - 140" L + W)

Machine Applique: A piece of fabric that is secured (or "applied") onto a background fabric with machine stitches. Does not include wool applique.

Mixed Technique: Two or more dominant techniques including to and not limited to applique, piecing, embroidery, dyeing, embellishment, painting, machine or hand quilting.

Miniature Quilt: Uses blocks no larger than 5" and measures no more than 48" L + W. A quilt larger than this is categorized as a wall hanging.

Serendipity: A fabric item that doesn't fit another category. For example: tree skirts, chatelaine, wool applique, purses, pillows, pin cushions, etc.

Table Runner/Topper: A quilted item that is meant to be displayed on a table. This would include runners, tablecloths, placemats, etc.

Wall Hanging: Any quilt, measuring up to 99" maximum L + W, suitable for display on a wall excluding miniature quilts. (up to 99" Maximum L + W)

Youth Quilt: A quilt made by someone 18 years of age and younger.
